### **COVID update**

Please do not send your children in to school if they display any of the three official symptoms of COVID, even if you believe the symptoms are indicative of an unrelated ailment. The three symptoms are: an elevated temperature (Government are now defining this as where the chest/back feel hot to the touch, although a temperature of 37.8 degrees or above remains a useful benchmark), a new persistent cough and/or a loss of taste/smell. A test should be sought at the earliest opportunity. This also applies to any other member of the household if symptoms are evident: children should not be sent into school until a negative test result has been obtained for that household member.

Details of how to access Seesaw (our Trust-wide online learning platform) were sent out earlier this week along with consent forms. Please return these as soon as possible if you haven't already – children for whom we don't receive consent will be archived and access to Seesaw will be denied. Seesaw will only be used where we have to isolate an entire class or the school has to be closed

I must also take this opportunity to thank the whole school community for their response to my decision to have staff wearing face coverings whenever they are outside their own class bubbles (plus the request for adults to wear face coverings at drop-off and pick-up). This measure is only truly effective with sufficient buy-in and I'm pleased to be able to see that all my staff and the overwhelming majority of other adults have done exactly that. Your support is very much appreciated.



## Tempest photography

On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November, Tempest Photography will be in school for their traditional Autumn Term visit. However, given the current situation around COVID, they will only be taking **individual** photographs and not sibling group photographs – this is to ensure that the photographers are able to maintain social distancing and not having to ‘arrange’ sibling groups into a photogenic pose!
